Our Lake Delta Yacht Club of Rome, Inc. was started in 1937 on lands (and a camp) donated by a local family. Lake Delta is a man made lake, the dam being completed in 1912. The waters from the Mohawk River were impounded as a reserve for the Erie (now Barge) Canal navigation. Unfortunately, the former village of Delta was lost. We had a bit of a dedication for the 100 year mark the day after our regatta.

LDYC has been racing Lightnings (as well as Comets) since the beginning. I have old movies (now on DVD) of our Club, some of the members, and of course racing. Lots of double & triple digit Lightning sails are shown. We had a focused fleet back then. Over the years the Lightning & Comet fleets dwindled, and the racing moved to Sailfish, then Sunfish. Albacores & Buccaneers made a showing as well. So...over the last several years, we have been steadily growing our Lightning fleet back to respectable status. We are now at 12, with 3 being Woodies.

Our Sunday afternoon races also dwindled over the years. This past year, we started a Monday Night Race League, first gun at 6:00 PM with 4 races run per night. It dropped to 3 as the daylight timed us out. Anyway, the LDYC/MNRL has been a fantastic success, and tonight is our 11th and final night. We'll have more Lightnings in the fleet for next year as three of the 12 are works in progress. For the first time in 4 years of ILCA regatta racing at our Club, we had some of our boats beat the boats of others. Now that's success, eh?
