JAMES TAYLOR OF COWAN LAKE WINS BARE BONES REGATTA

James Taylor and his crew, Carl Taylor and George Auer, from Cowan Lake Sailing Association, won Mansfield Sailing Club's fifteenth annual Bare Bones Regatta on Sunday, September 19th at Clear Fork Reservoir in Lexington, Ohio. The event drew Lightning class sailors from sailing clubs at Cowan Lake, Indian Lake, Cleveland and Buffalo. Five boats represented the Mansfield club and two of these finished in the top four. Tom Varley and his crew of Jon Varley and Matt "Bucky" Buchanan, from Mansfield, finished second, followed by Dave Samanich with Rob Graebert and Nate Ireland from Cleveland Yacht Club in third place and Bob Shutt with Zach Austin and Lisa Meadows, from Mansfield, in fourth.

Despite the forecast of light breezes for the weekend, the wind freshened to 10-15 mph on Saturday afternoon enabling four of the five scheduled races to be completed in beautiful sunny fall weather in the delightful surroundings of Clearfork Reservoir. Saturday's sailing was fast and challenging with plenty of changes in position during the races. Despite Saturday night's burning of a sail-boat replica, plentiful libations and lots of fireworks as an offering to Odin, Sunday dawned with scarcely a breath of wind. Crews passed the time playing cards and offering more libations to no avail. Finally, racing was abandoned as there was no wind and the results were decided on Saturday's races.

This was the fifteenth Bare Bones Regatta, which is held annually in September by Mansfield Sailing Club at its facility on Clear Fork Reservoir in Lexington. The race committee was provided by Marion Zaugg of Mohican Sailing Club.
