# XXXIX CAMPEONATO SUDAMERICANO

Creo que es buena oportunidad para escribir este artículo quizás por primera vez en la historia de la clase en Español. En buen sentido solo espero que en la "oficina" la Senora Donna Foote no se parezca a la dama de hierro (Senora Margaret Thatcher) y me devuelva estas líneas para traducirlas al Inglés, pero vale la

pena el riesgo de intentarlo.

Como ha sido típico en los últimos Campeonatos Sudamericanos organizados en el fabuloso Salinas Yacht Club navegamos a mediados de Abril, siempre en las tardes (2 pm.) acompañados de los tradicionales vientos suaves de la época, de una bahía tranquila que permite navegar desde temprana edad hasta bien pasados los setenta años y de un clima tropical suave donde no se conocen ni los chalecos ni los calcetines, bajo estas condiciones con 21 botes en la partida, navegamos las seis regatas programadas. La mayoría de ellas (4) con vientos entre 285° y 295° con la típica oscilación de 0 a 10 grados y las otras dos regatas con vientos alrededor del 240°. Estando más inestable en la dirección en la intensidad del viento.

Juan Santos, (último campeón Sudamericano en Salinas), Paco Sola (dos veces campeón Sudamericano) Ambos Ecuatorianos, Pablo Amunategui (Chile), mas un bote sorpresa eran para nosotros los competidores con mayores posibilidades de ganar.

Después de la segunda regata, el choclo se empezó a desgarrar quedando puntero Paco Sola con (2-1), nosotros con (1-3) y tercero Juan Santos con (3-2). Pablo (el Gato) Coloco (7-7) y el bote sorpresa no aparecía por ningún lado.

Al día siguiente se navegaron la tercera y cuarta regata y el panorama se puso color rosa por que nosotros con puestos (1-3-1-2) seguidos por Paco Sola (2-1-4-6) mas atras Juan Santo se ahorcaba sacando dos octavos consecutivos, al parecer tuvo pesadillas la noche anterior y Pablo Amunategui resucitaba (7-7-3-3) con dos buenas regatas mientras que el invitado sorpresa ya tenía nombre: Miguel Plaza, Jr.

Después de la quinta regata las cartas Estaban Hechadas, solo dos botes disputaban el primer lugar con ninguna posibilidad de perder el segundo puesto. La única posibilidad de Paco de campeón (1-2-4-6-1) era ganar la última regata y evitar que nosotros llegáramos segundos (2-1-3-1-2). Obviamente desde la partida de la sexta regata intentamos marcar a Paco con buen éxito en la primera pierna (entro 5th y nos 6th). Después con spinnaker quedaríamos nos 5th y el 6th. Mas tarde en la cuarta pierna el quedaría 4th y nosotros 6th. En la última cenida Paco recupero milagrosamente terminando segundo a escasos

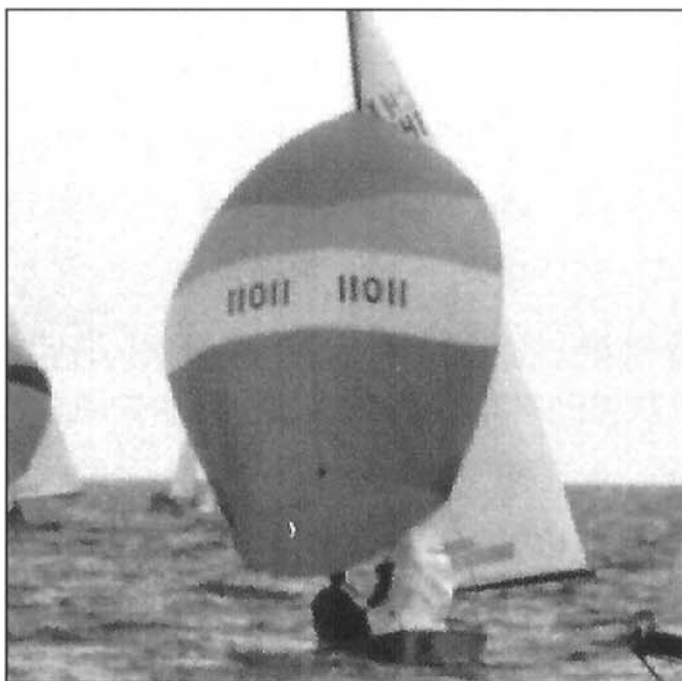
metros de Miguel Plaza, Jr. (el bote sorpresa) que con esa posición se ubicó en tercer lugar general desplazando a uno de los favoritos (J. Santos) al cuarto lugar.

Lindo campeonato, organizado estupendamente por nuestros amigos Ecuatorianos, con buenas fiestas casi todas las tardes en diferentes lugares (El Espigon, La Playa, El Hotel Miramar, y el Salinas Yacht Club) los cuales nos dieron una agradable entretenición después de las regatas, acompañados de la típica comida local ceviche, camarones y plátano frito (confieso que nunca lo probamos).

Además quiero felicitar a mi tripulación que sin ella no habría podido ganar en tan difícil cancha, un saludo para Rodrigo Zuazola y Rodrigo Guzman, y no debo dejar pasar la oportunidad de felicitar al campeón Sudamericano de las esuelas navales, cadete Pablo del Solar y tripulación de Chile.

Por último no podemos dejar de pensar que Salinas se visualiza como la posible próxima cancha que Sudamerica presente para próximo mundial de 1999. Esperamos que así sea.

# 42nd Lightning Class European Championship

## 9th July to 15th July 1994, Yverdon Les Bains, Switzerland

Die dies Jahrige Europameisterschaft fand zwar an einem neuen Ort statt, das Gewasser jedoch war von den beiden Meisterschaften in Grandson 1976 und 1985 bestens bekannt. Nach einer problemlosen Vermessung konnte am Sonntag nachmittag zur Trainingsregatta gestartet werden. Die thermische Bise am oberen Ende des Neuenburgersees war nicht allen Teilnehmern bekannt. Wer die Resultate der Trainingsregatta analysierte, wusste jedoch schon jetzt gut über diesen Wind Bescheid. WYLER, der hier 1976 seinen ersten Europameistertitel feierte, riskierte von Beginn weg recht viel, segelte aggressiv und erreichte mit ein wenig Glück drei Laufsiege in Folge. Das Zwischenklassement nach drei Laufen zeigte ein klares Verdikt. WYLER liegt mit 3 Punkten vor den drei italienischen Booten von RUSTICHELLI mit 8, ALAGNA mit 9 und NOTO mit 16 Punkten. Die Mannschaft WYLER, DUERR, DUERR versuchte in den folgenden Regatten mit dosiertem Risiko dem Druck dieser drei Boote Stand zu halten. Dies gelang im vierten Lauf problemlos, im fünften Lauf, bei einem schwierig zu segelnden Sudwestwind, mit viel Glück. WYLER sicherte sich damit zum dritten mal nach 1976 und 1989 die Goldmedallie. Die weiteren Medallienplätze wurden im sechsten Lauf ausgemacht und endeten mit dem Gewinn der Silbermedallie für ALAGNA und der Bronzemedallie für RUSTICHELLI. Auf den weiteren Plätzen finden wir NOTO mit dem vierten, MARINO mit dem fünften und PERRET mit dem sechsten Rang.

This year's European Championship was held in a new place but the body of water was very familiar because of the Championships in Grandson of 1976 & 1985. After measuring, which was accomplished without any problem, the practice race was able to be started on Sunday afternoon. The thermal breeze at the upper end of Lake Neuchâtel was not known to all participants. However, those who analyzed the results of the practice race knew quite well the affects of this wind. Wyler, who celebrated here his first European master title in 1976, took quite a few risks from the start, sailed aggressively, and was able to achieve three successful races as a result, After three races the interim results showed a clear verdict. Wyler with three points, placing ahead of the three Italian boats of Rustichelli with 8, Alagna with 9 and Noto with 16 points. The crew of Wyler, Dürr, Dürr tried in the following races to use measured risks to sustain the pressures of these boats. This succeeded in the fourth race without problems. In the fifth race with a west wind which made sailing difficult, Wyler, with much luck, was able to claim for himself, after 1976 and 1989, the gold medal for the third time. The other medals were determined in the 6th race and ended with the winning of the silver medal by Alagna and the bronze medal by Rustichelli. In the following positions we find Noto in fourth, Marino in fifth, and Perret with the 6th place.
