## Ier Dia de Regatas Campeonato Sudamericano De Lightning

Domingo 5 de diciembre del 2010 El día de hoy se inicio con normalidad el primer día de Regatas del "Campeonato Sudamericano de Velerismo clase Lightning2 con vientos que oscilaron entre 9 y 11 nudos con una ola pequeña y una corriente leve. A diferencia del día de práctica (Sábado 4 de diciembre), hoy el sol no acompaña a los veleristas más que en la primera regata y algo en la tercera. 25 barcos fueron de la partida en la lucha por el título Sudamericano en el mismo se encuentran participando representantes de Argentina, Brasil, Chile, Colombia y Ecuador.

Desde el día ayer y confirmándolo el día de hoy los favoritos entre los que se encuentran Tito Gonzales de Chile, Thomas Summer de Brasil, Roberto Ricover de Argentina, Juan Santos de Ecuador y Jonathan Martinetti también de Ecuador, se lanzaron a la disputa de las diferentes regatas palmo a palmo. En más de una competencia la llegada hizo muy difícil la tarea de los jueces presididos por Eduardo Vedani, debido a lo juntos que llegaban los barcos. Al término del primer día el campeonato está liderado por nuestro crédito ecuatoriano Juan Santos Garcés quien ganó 2 Regatas, seguido por Jonathan Martinetti y en tercer lugar Thomas Summer. La cuarta posición la ocupa Roberto Ricover, la quinta Tito Gonzales quien también ganó una regata.

## 2Do Dia de Regatas

6 de diciembre del 2010 Se cumplió con lo programado y con menos viento que ayer se corrieron las 3 regatas correspondientes al 2do dia del Cto Sudamericano de Velerismo clase Lightning. Los vientos que hoy fueron muy cambiantes oscilaron entre 7 y 11 nudos, un factor extra que sorprendió a muchos se añadió hoy: una muy fuerte corriente que hizo que algunos barcos tuvieran tropiezos con la Boya de Barlovento. El chileno Tito Gonzales se recuperó de un tropiezo con la boyas y ganó la primera regatta y la tercera del dia lo que le permite ir liderando posiciones al termino del segundo dia, Jonathan Martinetti quien ha hecho un campeonato muy regular ocupa al momento la segunda posición, sin embargo hay una protesta que debe dilucidarse hoy entre estos 2 participantes. Juan Santos ocupa el tercer lugar a tan solo 2 puntos Martinetti, el cuarto lugar es ocupado por Thomas Summer de Brasil y el quinto por Cristóbal Pérez de Chile.

## I<sup>st</sup> Day Of Racing Lightning South American Championship

Sunday December 5, 2010, began the first day of races of the South American Sailing Championship Lightning Class with winds ranging from nine to eleven knots with a small wave and a slight current. Unlike the practice day (Saturday, 4 December), today the sun did not accompany the sailors more than in the first race and some in the third. Twenty-five boats headed in the struggle for the South American title, with participants from Argentina, Brazil, Chile, Colombia and Ecuador.

The favorites were confirmed, including Tito Gonzales of Chile, Thomas Summer of Brazil, Roberto Ricover of Argentina, Juan Santos of Ecuador and Jonathan Martinetti, also from Ecuador. Many of the races were disputed by inches. Most of the competition was very difficult for the judges, chaired by Eduardo Vedani, due to boats arriving together. At the end of the first day, the championship is led by our Ecuadorian Juan Santos Garces, who won two races, followed by Jonathan Martinetti and thirdly Thomas Summer. The fourth position is occupied by Roberto Ricover, the fifth by Tito Gonzales, who also won a race.

## 2<sup>nd</sup> Day Of Racing

Monday December 6, 2010, We were met on schedule and, with less wind than yesterday. Three races were run for the second day of the South American Championships. The winds today were quite variable, ranging between seven and eleven knots. An extra factor that surprised many was added—a very strong current that caused some boats to trip over the windward mark. The Chilean Tito Gonzales overcame a stumble on the float and won the first regatta, putting him in the lead at the end of the second day. Jonathan Martinetti, who has done a very regular championship, occupied the second position. There was, however, a protest that needed to be resolved between two participants, Juan Santos is in third place just two points behind Martinetti. Fourth place was occupied by Thomas Summer of Brazil and the fifth by Christopher Perez of Chile.

## 3 Dia de Regatas

7 de diciembre del 2010 Culminó con éxito el 56 campeonato de Velerismo clase Lightning. Las dos regatas programadas para el dia de hoy se retrasaron debido a la protesta que existía entre la protesta de Jonathan Martinetti (ECU) y Tito Gonzales (CHI); la misma que los jueces consideraron desestimarla. El viento oscilo entre 11 y 13 nudos y el sol acompañó a las dos regatas; que como en todas las anteriores fueron muy competitivas. El chileno Tito Gonzales, Ganador del campeonato, se adjudico de las dos regatas correspondientes al dia de hoy; El ecuatoriano Juan Santos termino en la segunda posición, seguido de Jonathan Martinnett, Cristobal Perez y Thomas Summer. Como invitados especiales estuvieron muy cerca de la cancha de regatas, un par de ballenas jorobadas quienes disfrutaron como el que más del campeonato.

## 3<sup>rd</sup> Day Of Racing

Tuesday December 7, 2010, fifty-six successfully completed the Lightning Class Sailing Championship. The two races scheduled for today were delayed due to the protest between Jonathan Martinetti (ECU) and Tito Gonzales (CHI); the judges rejected the protest. The wind ranged from eleven to thirteen knots, and the sun shone during the two races, both of which were very competitive. The Chilean Tito Gonzales, winner of the championship, won the two races today, the Ecuadorian Juan Santos finished in second place, followed by Jonathan Martinnett, Chris Perez and Thomas Summer. Special guests, very close to the race course, were a pair of humpback whales who appeared to enjoy the championship.
